Students with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology **may be** required to complete foundational coursework depending on their undergraduate courses listed and program objectives. **Graduate Record Exam (GRE) Targets:** Verbal (148), Quantitative (140), Writing (3.5). **TOEFL**: 550 minimum or 213 for computer version for international students. **GPA** of 2.75 in last 60 semester units, 3.0 is preferred.
